College Level Examination Program (CLEP) Test Provides examination which cover the equivalent course work of the first and second year of a college Liberal Arts program. In addition to general area examinations, there are also a variety of examinations in English Composition, Literature, Foreign languages, Social Sciences, History, Science, Math & Business.

CLEP Test centers in the Boston area are: Bunker Hill Community College, University of Massachusetts, North Shore Community College, Mass Bay Community College, and Suffolk University. All administer CLEP examination, but on different days and at different times. ### **CLEP ACADEMIC GUIDELINES**

1. CLEP credit policy is subject to change upon reevaluation of CLEP examination as determined by the academic
2. The award of CLEP credits is also subject to the academic policies in effect at the college
3. CLEP credits may be used to satisfy general education requirements as well as degree or certificate requirements. (A maximum of 45 credits can be used towards a degree).
4. An official transcript must be sent to BHCC, CLEP CODE # 3123, in order to Processes credit.
5. A grade of "P" (pass will appear on your transcript for successfully completed CLEP Exams.
6. The word "CLEP" will appear after the number and title of the course on your transcript.

### **CLEP OPTION FOR COLLEGE WRITING I & II**

Students who pass the CLEP/English composition with essay exam with a score of 4 higher will be eligible to receive 3 credits for the College Writing I course offered at BHCC.

An option to receive credit for college Writing II is available to students who score or higher on the exam. You will be required to meet with the communication department chairperson. At this meeting a discussion will be held in order to determine any additional requirements necessary to demonstrate proficiency at the College Writing II.
